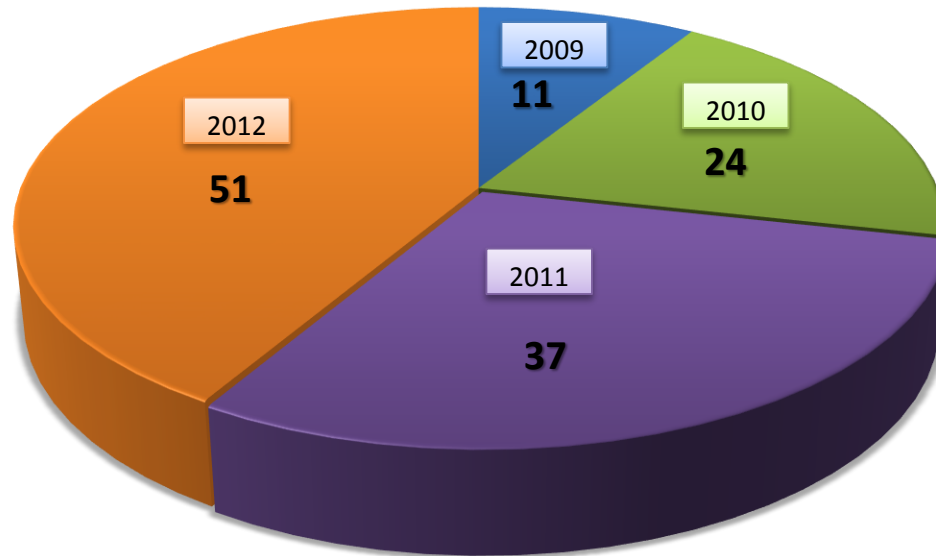

Biggest barrier to transplantation in your country: Capacity of Transplant Centers and number of Accredited Centers for trasplants.

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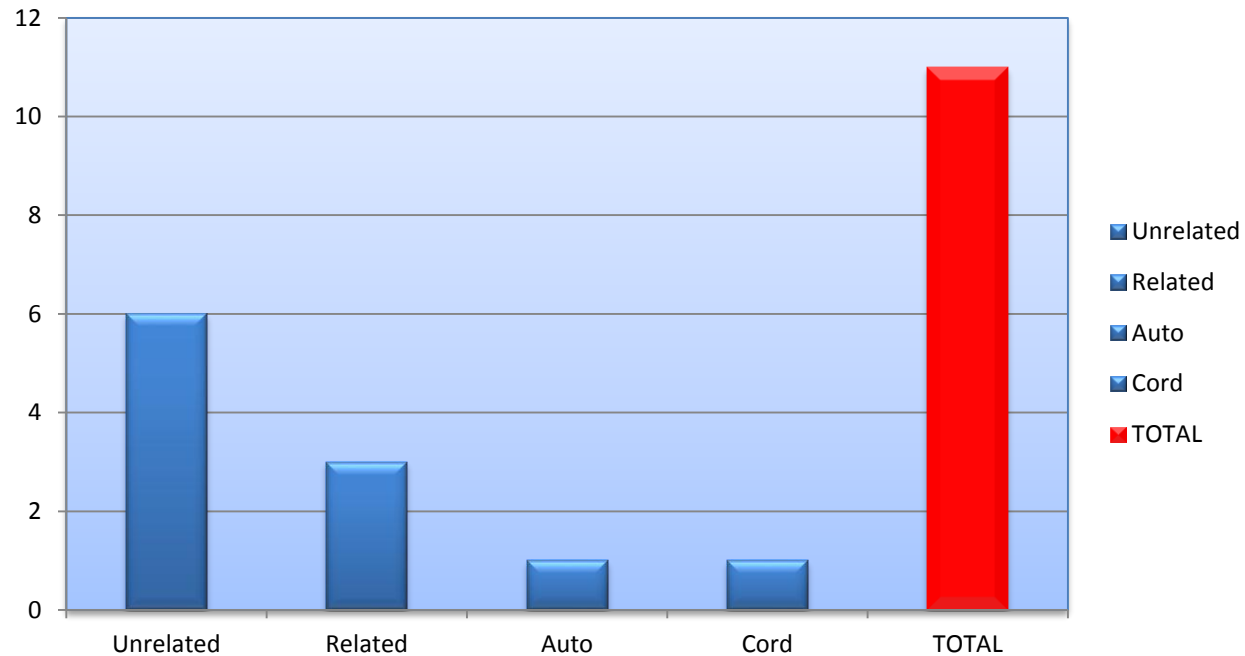


ECUADOR TRASPLANTS IN ACCREDITED CENTERS 2009 – 2010 – 2011 - 2012



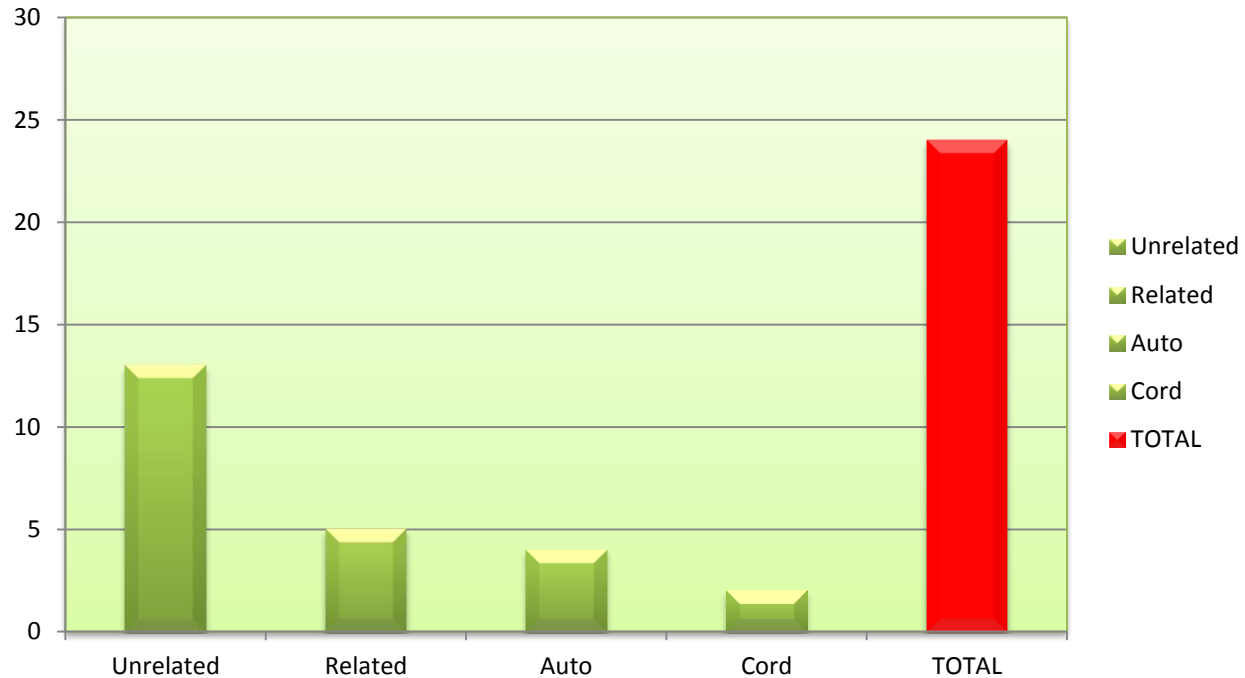


ECUADOR TRANSPLANTS: 2009



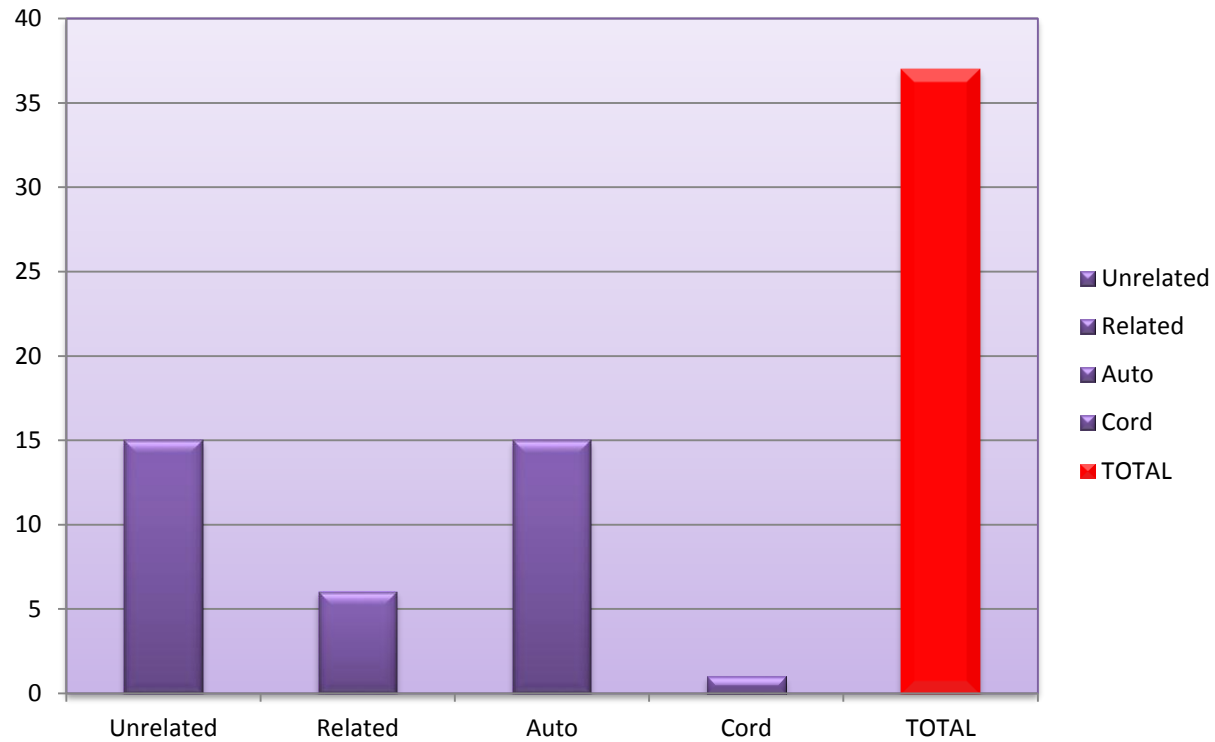


ECUADOR TRANSPLANTS: 2010



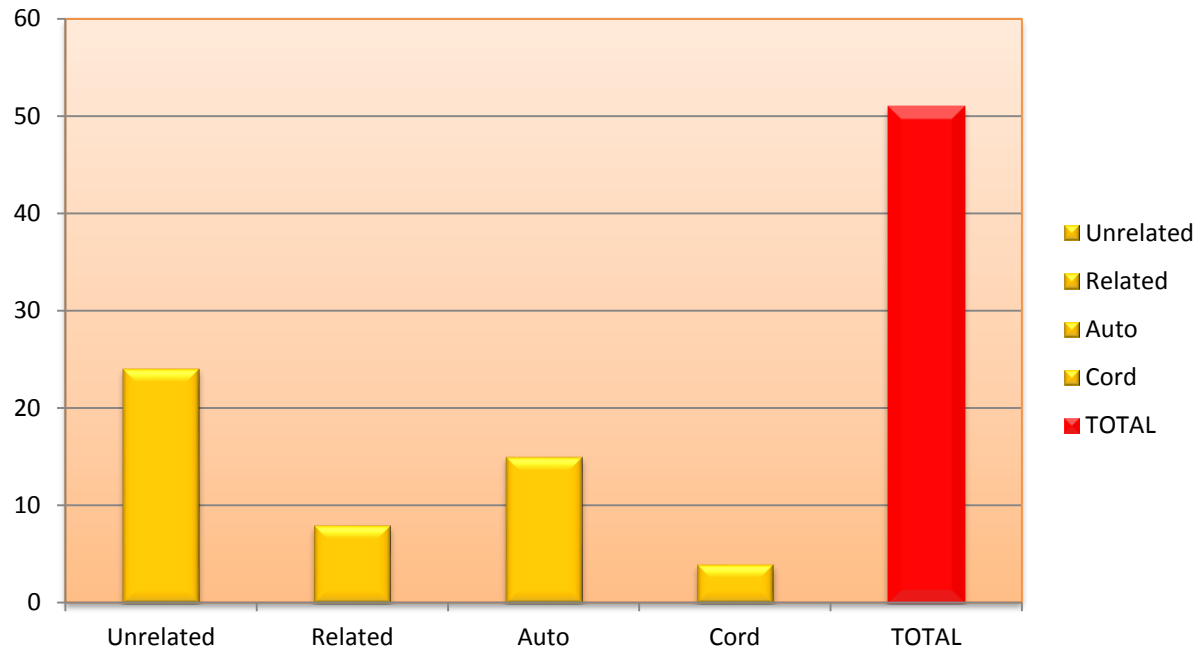


ECUADOR TRANSPLANTS: 2011



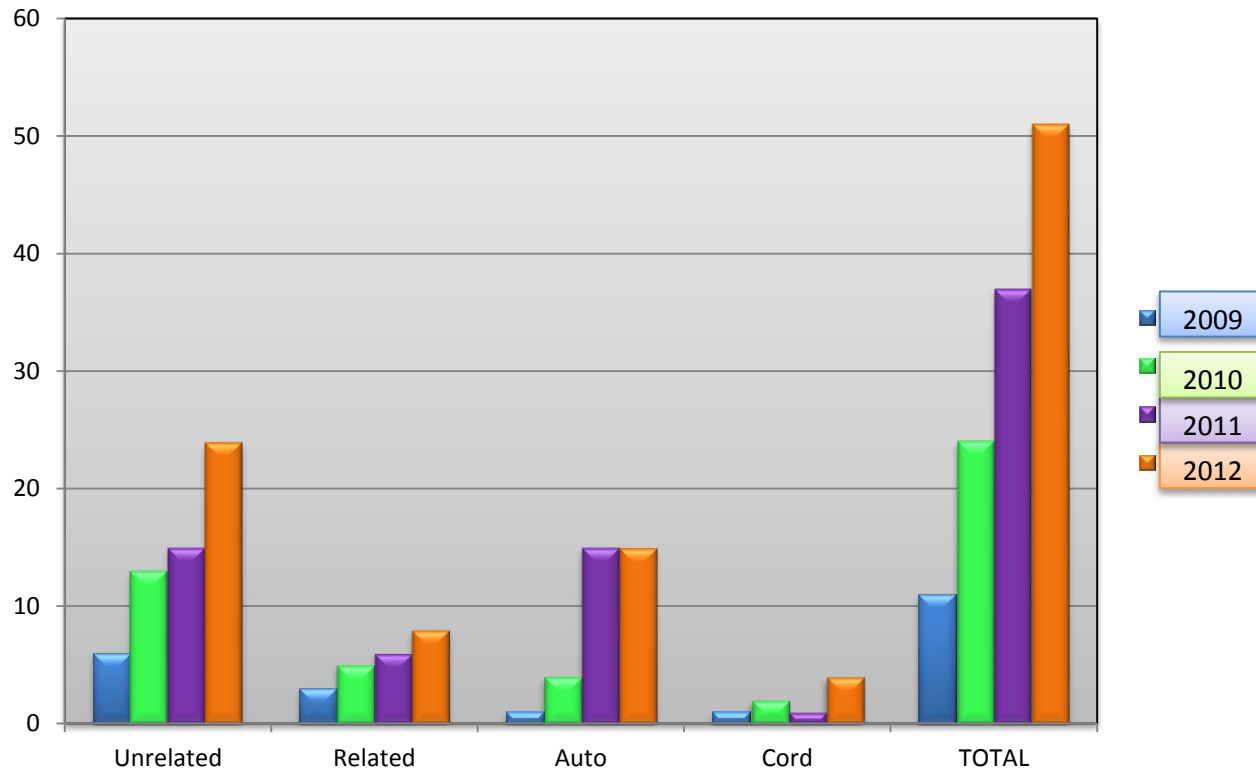
